
If you choose to take your

availability at those locations.




Next you will be able to select your preferred test center along with the date and time of the appointment.




If you choose to take your exam online with OnVUE: Please make sure you are prepared to take the exam online by reviewing the expectations on this screen.




Next, choose an appointment date and time for your exam. Please make sure you confirm your time zone.
